There are lots of fun ways to keep the Christingle light burning and this guide will give you some ideas, and perhaps inspire you to come up with your own.

The Meaning of Christingle

Over fifty years ago, Christingle, a traditional German service, was introduced to Anglican churches by The Children's Society. Since then, collections and donations given on the occasion of Christingle have enabled the charity to change the lives of thousands of vulnerable children and young people in England.

Since 1968, many churches in Scotland have celebrated Christingle and Aberlour has been fortunate to have benefited from many collections and donations marking this occasion.

The Christingle celebration is named after the Christingles that are lit during the service. Christingles are made from an orange decorated with red tape/ribbon, sweets and a candle. Your Christingle celebration is an opportunity to bring your community together and to experience the joy and wonder of this well-loved Christmas tradition.



There is no one way to hold a Christingle celebration, meaning that it's easy to adapt if you can't get together in person. The service usually includes prayers, readings, hymns and carols, and of course the lighting of the Christingles. Christingle was created with children in mind, and the celebrations are the perfect event for children and families and can be enjoyed by people of all ages, especially if they don't regularly attend church.

How to make a Christingle:

- 1. Fasten a red ribbon/tape around an orange
- 2. Cut a small cross into the top of the orange
- 3. Place a glow stick or candle in the cross
- 4. Load a mixture of dried fruit/sweets on to the cocktail sticks, ensuring the points are covered
- 5. Insert the sticks around the base of the glow stick/candle
- 6. Store upright in a cool place
